

SHARING AND CARING FOR AT-RISK OLDER ADULTS WITH DEMENTIA OR DISABILITIES/COMORBIDITIES

CHALLENGE

The SACRED project is fueled by the recognition of a critical gap in the current healthcare education system regarding the care of older adults, particularly those with dementia or

disabilities/comorbidities.

The increasing prevalence of dementia across Europe, coupled with the diverse needs of older adults with dementia or disabilities/comorbidities,

necessitates specialized knowledge and skills among caregivers.

SACRED's motivation stems from the urgent need to address these challenges through innovative educational approaches.



RESULTS

- Report of evidence based interventions/good practices;
- Report of Needs Assessment and report of GAP Analysis;
- Database of 20 good practices from 6 pilot sites: Italy, Veneto Region (by ISRAA Treviso), Belgium (by Odisee University of Applied Sciences), the Netherlands by Rotterdam (City & Rotterdam University of Applied Sciences), Spain, (by Polibienestar University of Valencia and by Anrimac, San Cristóbal de La Laguna), Greece, Syros (by Altera Vita);
- A co-created E-Learning Platform, tested by 96 learners divided as follows: 48 students and 48 professionals. Each one of the 6 pilot actions will reach 8 students and 8 professionals;
- A comprehensive awareness campaign.

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Offering a scalable and sustainable solution that can be implemented across Europe to improve the quality of life for older adults by improving the competency of those who care for them.



















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
